Reflection

The purpose of this project was to re-create the story of The Tempest by William Shakespeare. The story itself contains several themes, which highlights the emergence of the Triangular Slave Trade. Our reinvented version portrays power dynamics and a social structure, which includes the minor characters gaining more power over the major characters. We used the background information of the characters to recreate the story and give them a new purpose.

We presented our idea through a painting to show a visual representation of Power dynamics. Prospero talks to Gonzalo telling him negative things about Alonso to overthrow him and become king. Prospero talks Gonzalo into his scheme and tells him he will make him king if he helps him against Alonso. Gonzalo believing him shares all of Alonso's secrets with Prospero. With his desire for power and revenge, Prospero will take any steps to get back at him. Another scenario, which depicts the power dynamic in the story, is when Caliban falls in love with Miranda because of the time they spent together on the island, but has to fight Ferdinand in order to be with her.
